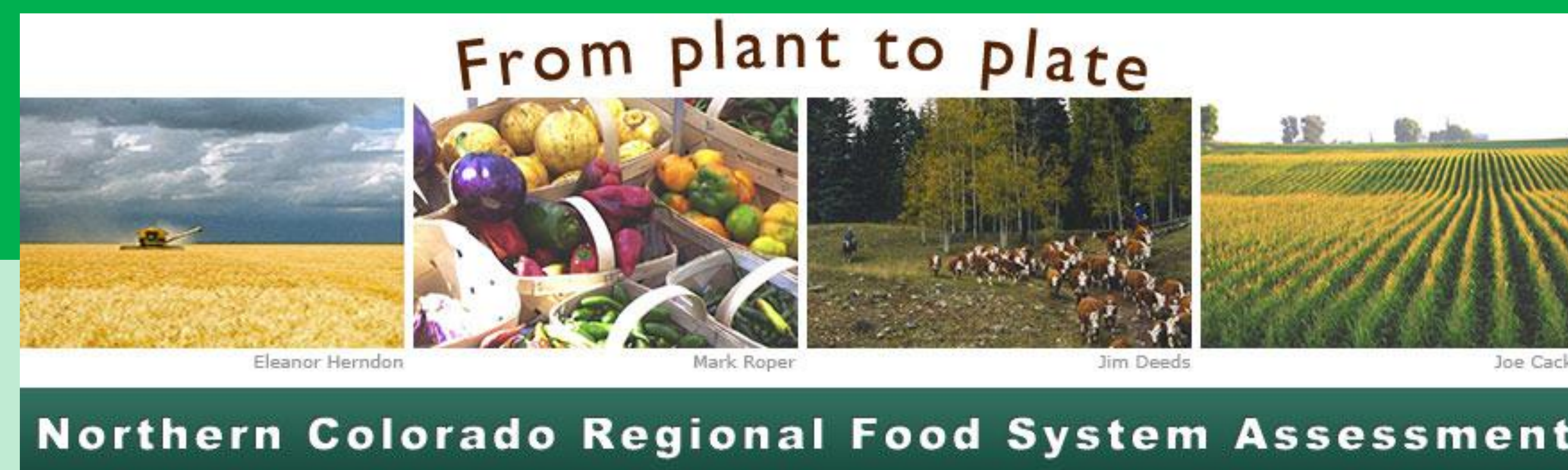
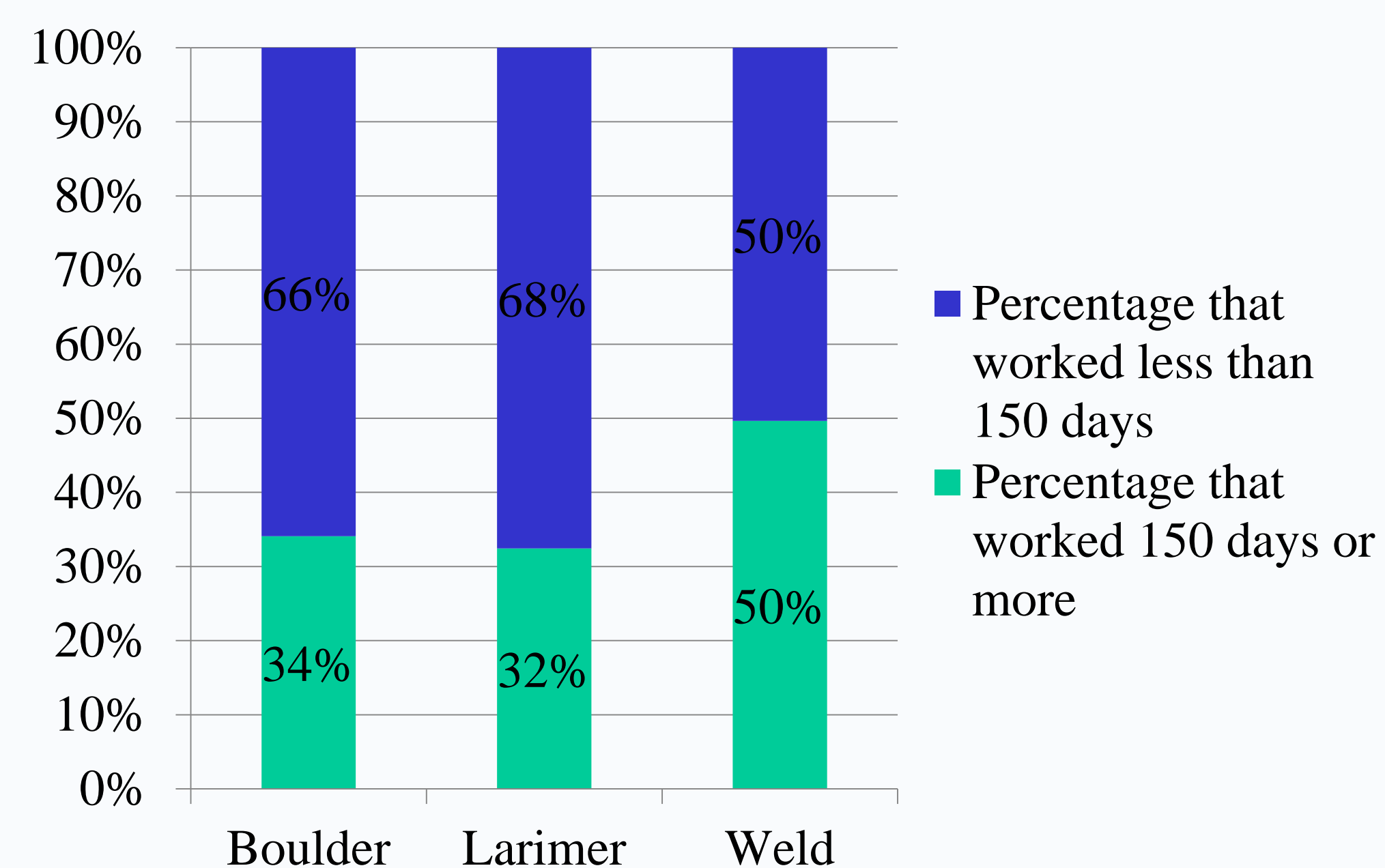

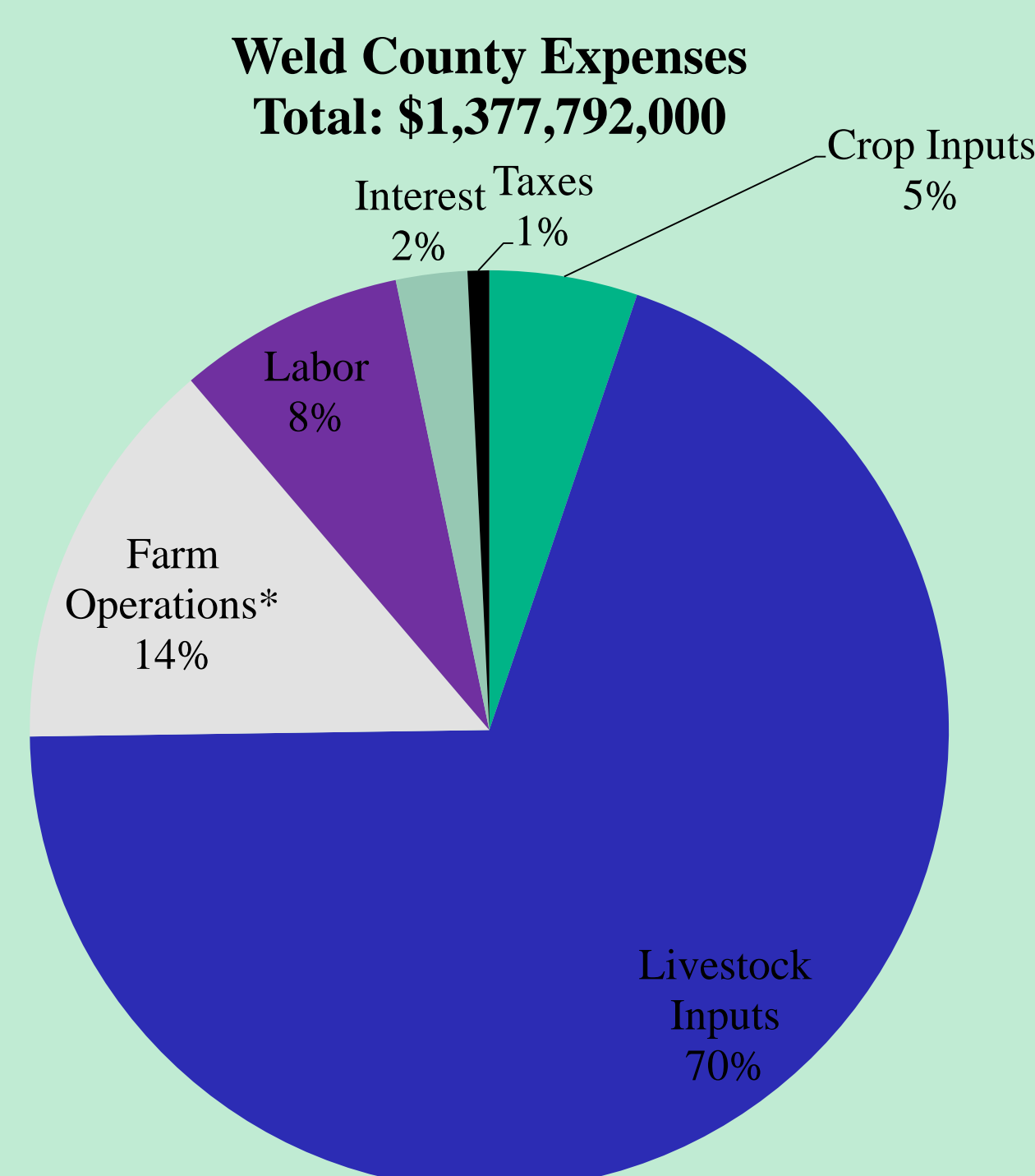
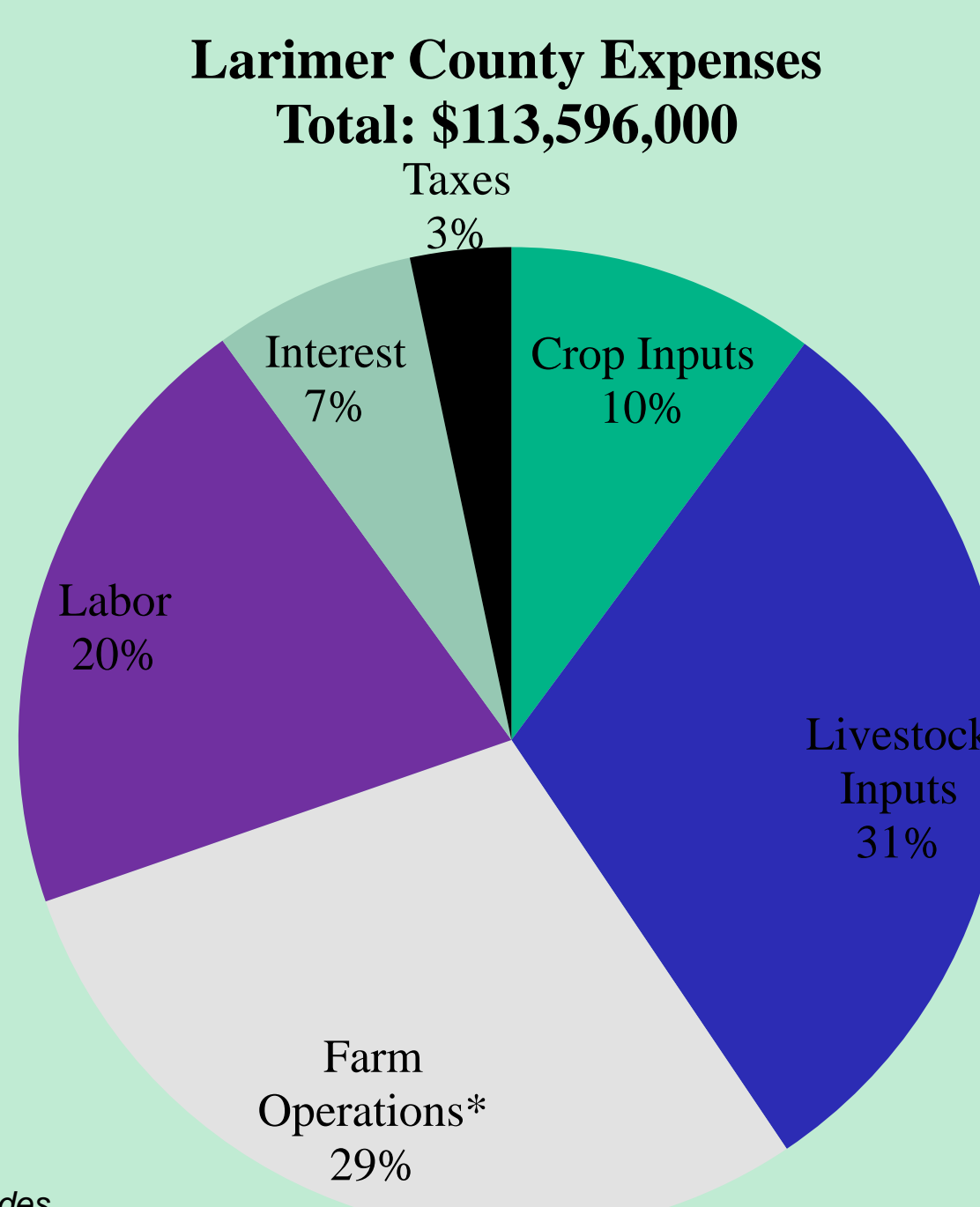
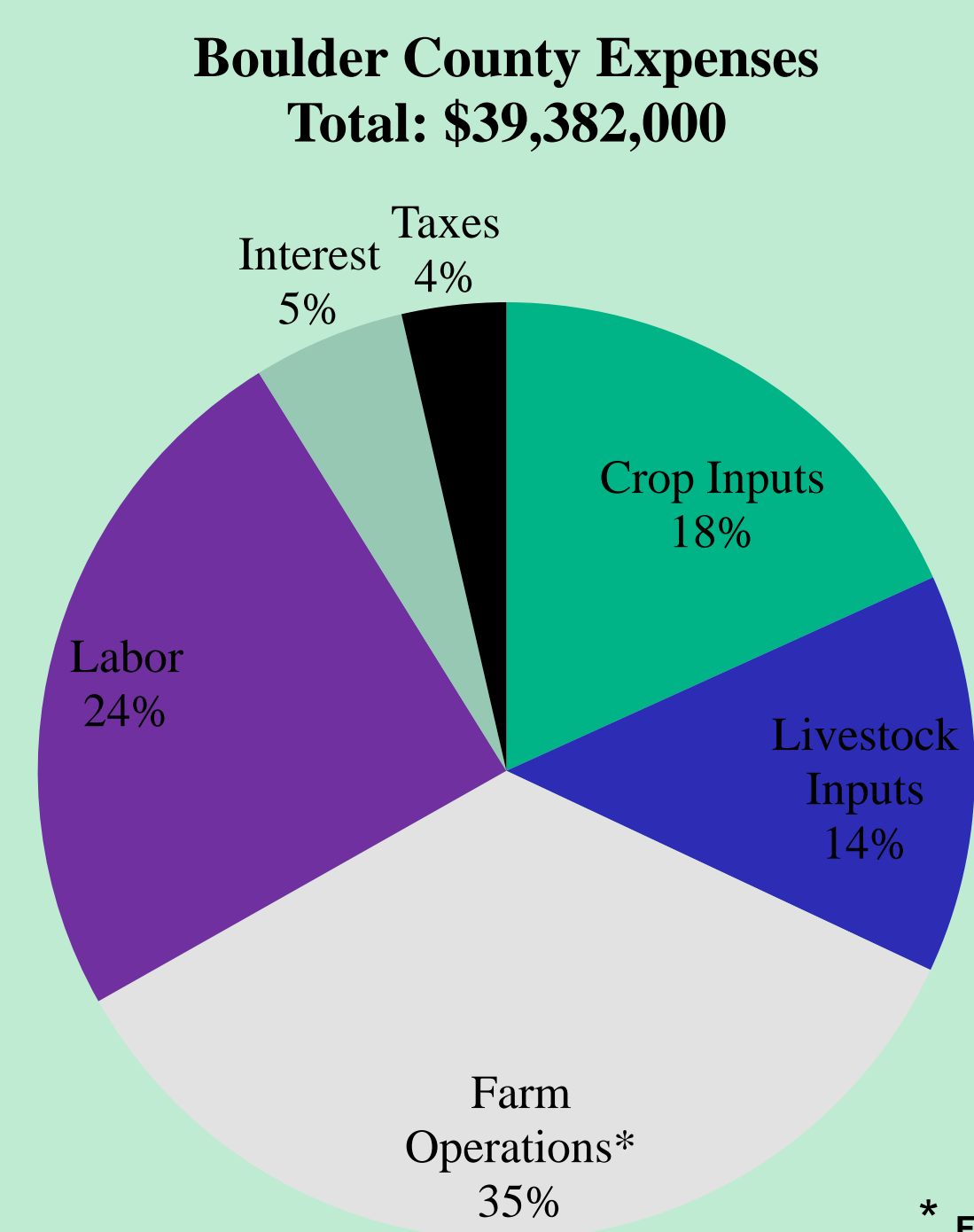
Hired Labor



Hired Labor in 2007:

- On average, Weld County farms spent more per worker than Boulder or Larimer County farms
- On average, Boulder County farms spent slightly more per worker than Larimer County farms
- Weld County farms hired 7x more workers than Boulder County farms, and 3x more workers than Larimer County farms

2007 Census of Agriculture Reported Farm Expenses

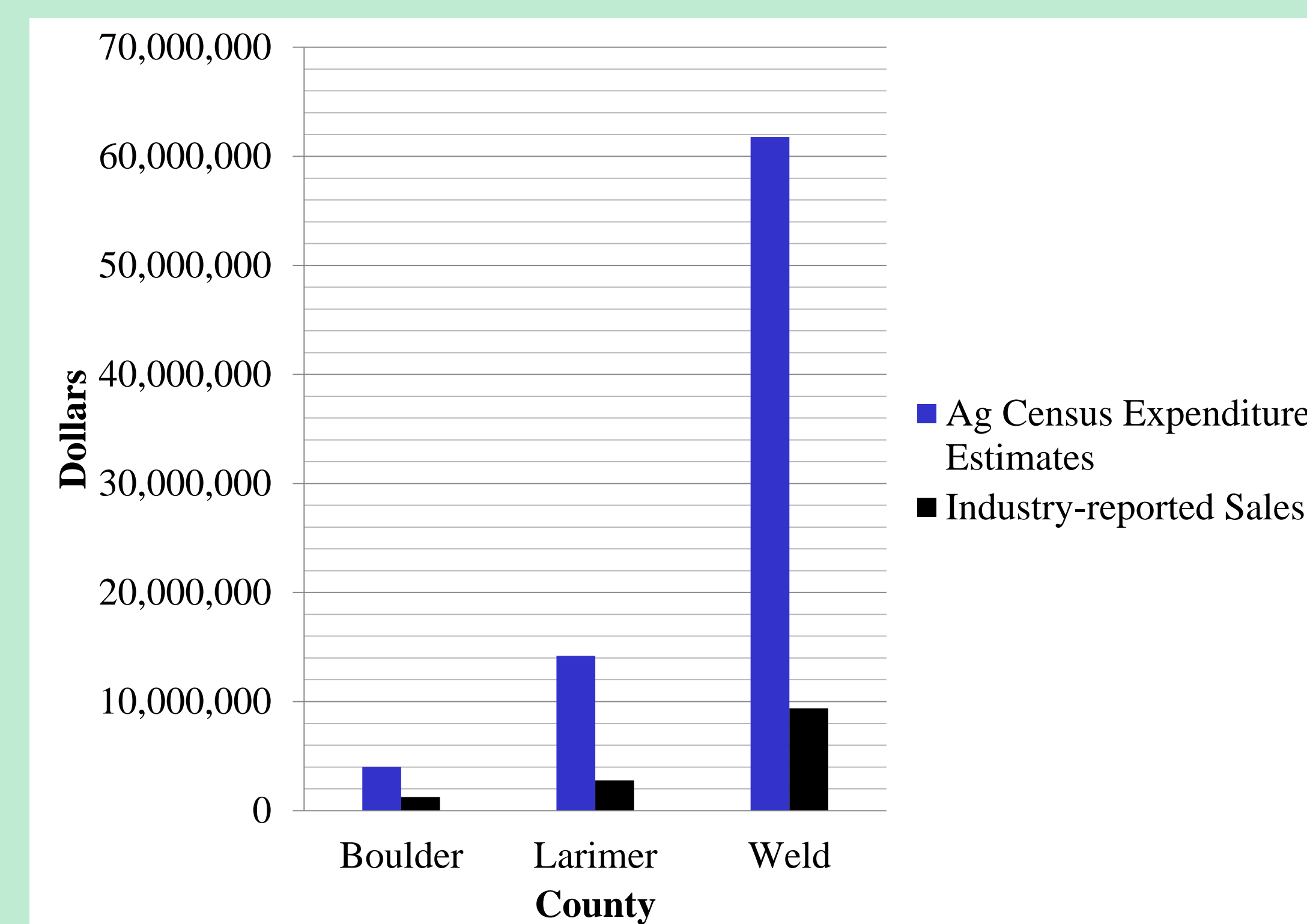


* Farm Operations includes rent on land, buildings, pasture, machinery, and vehicles, as well as maintenance, supplies, utilities, fuels, and other costs

Farm Expenses:

- Livestock Inputs included purchases of livestock for breeding and finishing, as well as feed
- The large share of Weld County's farm expenses categorized as livestock inputs reflects the concentration of livestock feeding in the county
- 2009 expense estimates fell 6.4% from 2008 levels for the U.S. as a whole
- Fuel expenditures fell 22.5% from 2008 levels across the U.S.
- Farm expenditures decreased in all major categories across the U.S.

Farm Equipment Sales



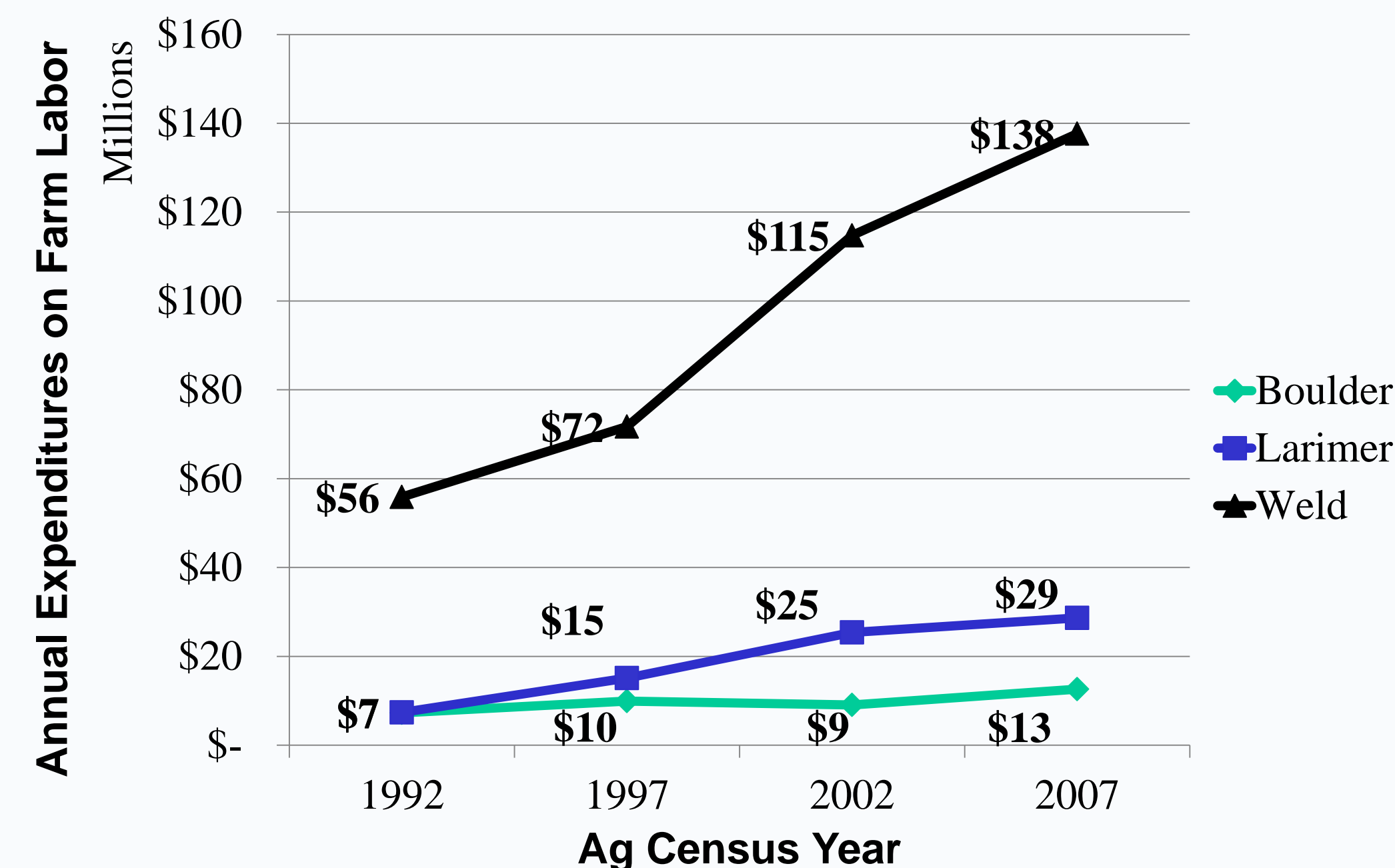
This graphic illustrates the dependence of regional agriculture on inputs obtained from other parts of the state and country.

Ag Census expenditure estimates reflect the amount of money that farmers spent on machinery and equipment, from any source. Industry reported sales reflect the dollar amounts of new equipment sold by dealers.

Inflation-Adjusted Expenditures on Farm Labor



Key Findings:

- From 1992 to 2007, farm labor expenditures increased faster than the national rate in Larimer County, slower in Boulder County, and similarly in Weld County
- Since 1992, the number of farm workers hired has fallen in Weld and Boulder Counties and risen in Larimer County
